Who is this guide for?

This guide is for applicants wanting to apply for headspace's Allied Health Graduate roles and the First Nations Allied Health Graduate roles.

Please note First Nations applicants will have a slightly different online application form and placement preferences will be discussed with applicants at the interview stage. Applicants applying for the non-First Nations graduate positions will be asked to provide placement preferences in the online form.

How to prepare your online application

The application form will ask you to provide;

- Information about your qualifications and working rights
- Details of ONE professional referee
- Your preferences for placements at the headspace centres participating in the program
- Answers to short answer questions

If you received a formal recommendation to apply for this program via a headspace manager or delegate, you will need to provide those details as well. Note, **it is NOT a pre-requisite for applying to have a formal recommendation**. It is an option available for those already connected to a headspace centre.

- What do you need to consider to effectively work holistically with young people in a mental health context? If relevant, draw on your previously experience working or on student placement with young people (Max 300 words)

- This program requires graduates to complete two placements at different headspace services. It is strongly encouraged that one of those placements is in a regional, rural or remote service.

- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, and ability to listen and build relationships with internal and external stakeholders
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively in a multi-disciplinary team
- Commitment to supporting clinical research within the service
- Willingness to work in a regional, rural, or remote headspace service for a 12-month rotation
- Capacity to travel to Melbourne for training as required

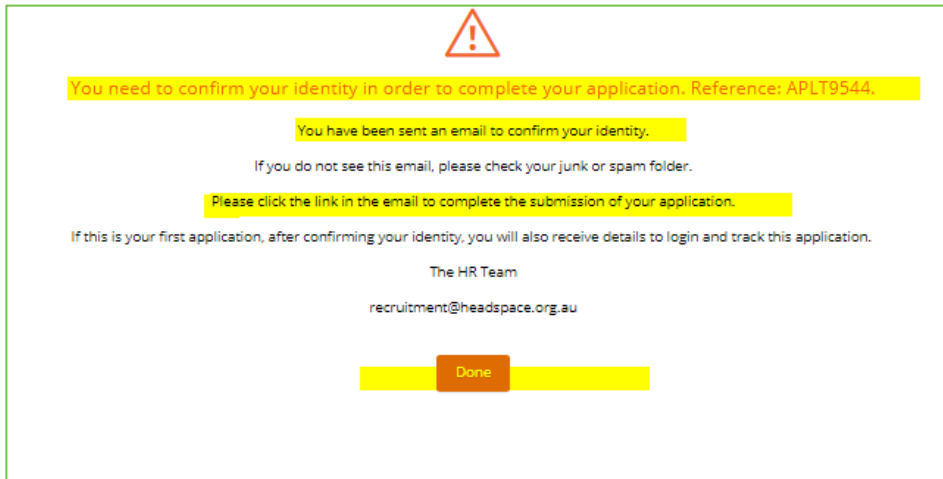

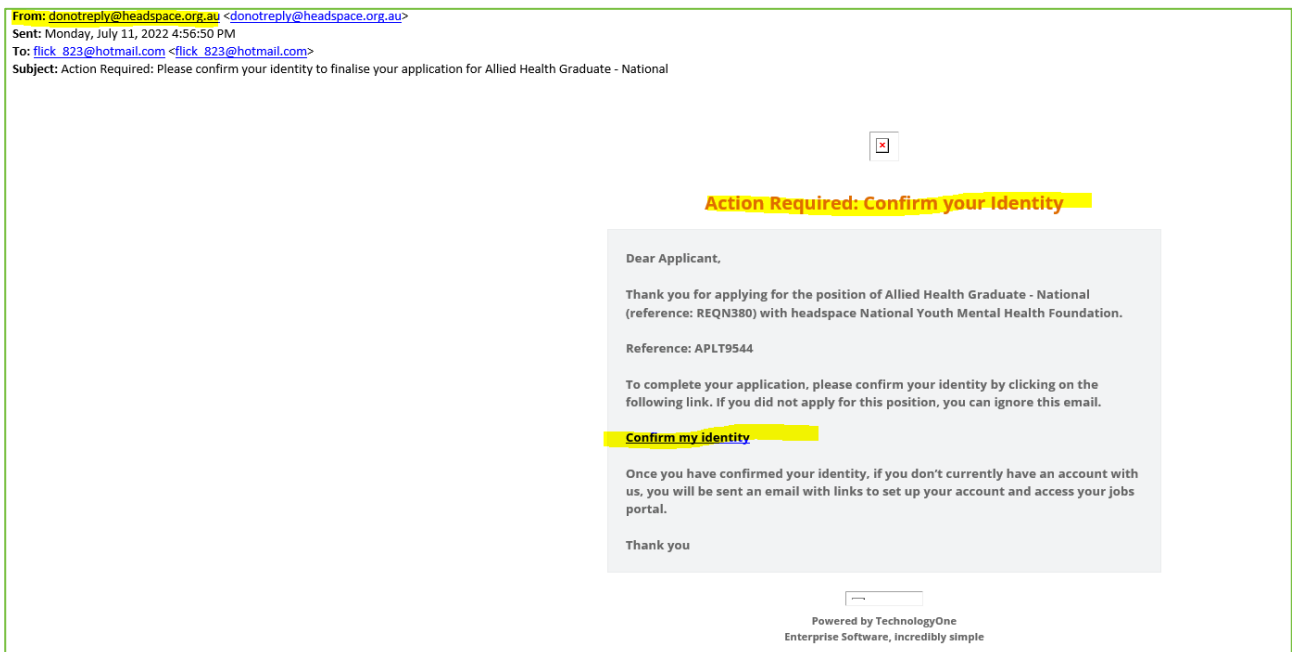

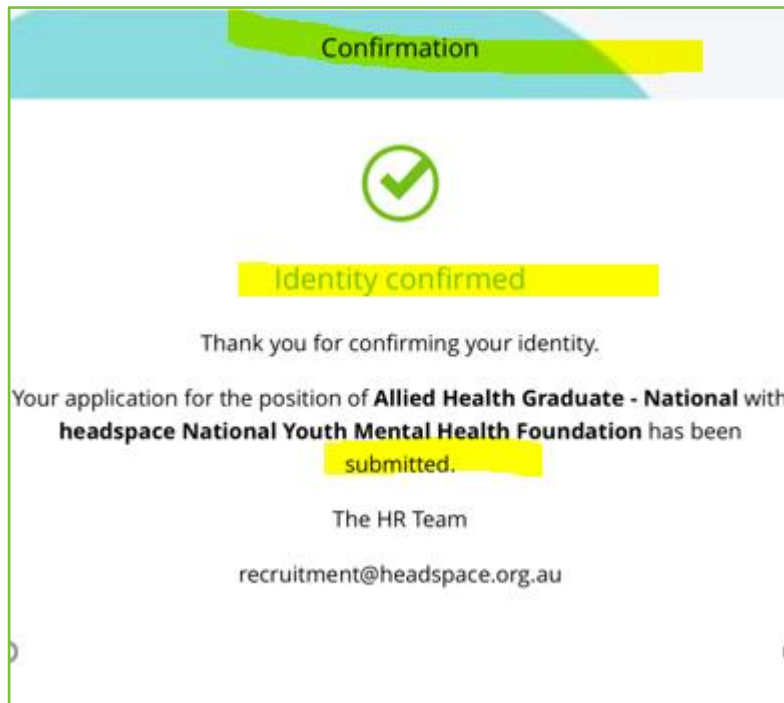
